SPECIAL AGENTS AND POST OFFICE INSPECTORS.

The information contained herein has been gathered from various authentic sources and includes generally those officers who served prior to installation of the present roster cards, inspectors in charge, Chief Inspectors, departmental officers, etc. Abbreviations used include:

GM--"Guarding the Mails," by P. Henry Woodward, Chief Special Agent.
OPB--"Old Post Bags," by Alvin Harlow.
OR--Official Register of the United States.
PG--Postal Guide.

The first title used seems to have been surveyor (still used in the British Posts), later changed to agent, special agent and post office inspector.

When Benjamin Franklin was Postmaster General under the British Post he acted as his own surveyor and visited all the offices except Charleston. He laid out new post routes so as to expedite transmission of the mails and caused mile posts to be erected on the route from Boston to Philadelphia. (OPB)

After Franklin became Postmaster General under the Constitution, William Goddard, who has assisted in laying out post routes under the Continental Congress, was appointed surveyor.

Preston S. Loughborough, of Kentucky, was a general agent of the department from 1829 to 1835.

Early official registers show certain departmental employees as being assigned to mail depredations, including:

PERSONNEL.

ORGANIZATION.

In the official registers for 1837-1839 the agents listed are shown as assigned to "sections," entitled Northeast, Northwest, Southern, Southwest and Middle. Just what States were embraced in each of these sections has not been determined. Assignments to various States were shown in 1843 and again during the period from 1855 to 1869 (1867 being missing from the files.)

EDWARD R. PETHERBRIDGE is believed to have been the first Chief Special Agent. He was addressed as such in letters of 1871 and 1874; in October, 1874, he used a letter head with that title, showing his office as at Baltimore, although OR 1871 and 1873 listed him as "superintendent postal railway service." Effective October 31, 1874, he resigned as chief special agent and was reappointed as special agent assigned to mail depredations.

CHARLES COCHRAN JR., though apparently holding the position earlier, as shown on the preceding page, was formally appointed "Chief of division for the office of mail depredations under Act June 1, 1842," effective July 1, 1872, at \$2500. His name appeared in the list of special agents whose commissions were renewed for the calendar year 1870.

P. HENRY WOODWARD is said to have been appointed Chief Special Agent in December, 1874, although his name appears in OR 1875 as "superintendent postal railway service." Effective July 1, 1875 he established divisions of special agents at Chicago and Saint Louis, postmasters in designated States being directed to report to the agents at those places, as well as to the Chief Special agent, mail depredations coming to their knowledge. Similar divisions were later set up at Atlanta, Austin and Knoxville.

As indicated in the printed list shown on the preceding page, certain agents were known as "post office inspectors" as early as 1869 or 1870. The act of 1880 changed the title of special agent to post office inspector. Agents in charge became inspectors in charge and divisions continued in operation, but for several years "field" divisions were maintained in other States. Divisions listed in the Postal Guide for Jan. 1881, included:

The number of divisions was increased to 12 about 1885 and to 15 about 1900. Further details are shown in connection with the several divisions.

Commenting upon the work of special agents in 1875, P. Henry Woodward, in "Guarding the Mails," said:

"The force, especially before the late radical reform in its organization, had its full share of incompetent triflers; but such agents were the accidents of politics, without heart in the work and destitute of the inborn talent, application and fidelity necessary to success. After sporting commissions for brief periods they exploded like bubbles and stand upon the records as mere shadows of names. * * A few agents of rare gifts and great experience actually performed nine-tenths of the important labor."

Appointments were on a political basis until the civil service reform act went into effect and civil service rules were not extended to inspectors in charge until about 1900. Many early inspectors in charge, when appointed, had little or no postal experience or any previous training as investigators.

COMPENSATION.

Early appropriation acts fixed the maximum compensation of special agents as follows:

1843, \$1250	1845, \$1050	1851 \$1600
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OR 1857 indicates that special agents were then paid \$1600 and \$2 per diem "when actually employed." In 1869 and 1871 the two agents assigned on the Pacific Coast were paid \$2500 each, while those in other sections received \$1600. The per diem was increased to \$3 in 1873.

Act June 17, 1878, limited salaries to \$1600 and provided for actual expenses, "not to exceed \$5 per day." Act July 5, 1884, left salaries unchanged but provided a per diem of \$4, "to cover food, lodging, sleeping car fares, omnibus and hack fares and other expenses of a personal character."

P. L. & R. for 1887 shows that inspectors were then appointed for a probationary period of six months at \$1200 and at the end of that time advanced to \$1600. An intermediate grade of \$1400 seems to have been introduced about 1890.

From 1901 to 1920 the allowance of per diem at any one place was limited to 20 days. If an assignment away from his domicile and residence continued longer the inspector had to take up some employment at another place for at least one day (called "breaking continuity") or his claims for per diem in excess of 20 days would be disallowed.

The per diem rate of \$4 continued with little change, except that sleeping car fares were allowed as travel expense within rather narrow limits, until July 1, 1911, when the per diem was reduced to \$3 and salaries of field men increased from \$1200, \$1400 and \$1600 to \$1500, \$1700 and \$1900, with a few places for men at \$2100.

Acts of 1889 and 1890 provided for 15 positions each at \$2000 and \$2250, without per diem, allocated to inspectors stationed in the larger centers and generally known as "city" inspectors. Like inspectors in charge, when employed away from their domiciles they were allowed actual expenses, not exceeding \$5 per day. An additional 10 places at \$2400 were provided about 1905.

Compensation continued as above until July 1, 1920, when the "city" positions were discontinued and the entire force placed on salaries ranging from \$2300 to \$3700, with actual expenses limited to \$5 per day. The reclassification act of January 1, 1925, advanced each grade \$300 per annum. The force was again placed on a per diem basis in 1929; the Walsh Act, with the present grades, went into effect in August, 1935.

A Chief Special Agent was first provided for in Act March 3, 1879, although the title had been in use some years, as indicated above; the salary was fixed at \$3000.

Ten special agents at \$2500 each, without per diem, to be assigned at "important points," were provided for in Act June 17, 1878. The number was increased to 12 in 1891 and to 15 in 1900. In the meantime they became inspectors in charge, the compensation being increased to \$3000 about 1905 and to \$4200 in 1920, with further increase to \$4500 on January 1, 1925.

From about 1870 to 1897 certain agents and inspectors were charged to the Money Order and Free Delivery Services, though in many cases at least they seem to have been employed in general work under the direction of the Chief Special Agent or Chief Inspector.

SERVICES ABSORBED.

From about 1898 there was a force of rural agents assigned in divisions. In many cases the inspector in charge was also rural agent in charge, while in other sections the two services were separate and distinct. The entire force of rural agents was transferred to the inspection service effective July 1, 1906.

Forces of Assistant Superintendents of the Registry and Salary & Allowance divisions, with agents of the Classification division, were transferred to the inspection service July 1, 1911. (See list at end of this work.)

Headquarters were moved to Chattanooga effective Oct. 15, 1884, during the regime of S. S. Hartshorn Jr. as inspector in charge; they were transferred back to Atlanta January 1, 1886, during the incumbency of Henry Booth, and again transferred to Chattanooga May 20, 1889, after the appointment of Alonzo G. Sharp.

The Atlanta division was reestablished August 1, 1907, with George M. Sutton in charge, contemporaneously with discontinuance of the San Juan division.

The San Juan division, covering Puerto Rico, was set up July 1, 1901, under Lawrence Letherman. Frank M. Hamilton was placed in charge on November 9, 1903, and served until the division was discontinued.

Geographical Area.

It has not been determined with certainty just when Boston was established as a division headquarters. Guides of the early '80s directed postmasters in certain States to report depredations to the inspectors listed. Guides for 1884-1885 directed postmasters in Connecticut to report depredations to the inspector in charge at New York, but P.G. Jan. 1, 1886 directed them to report to the Inspector in Charge at Boston, along with the other New England States.
